Character Plus, a Missouri 501(c)(3), has the nation's only successful evidence-based character education school improvement process known to increase academic performance, reduce incidents of negative classroom behaviors, and increase student, teacher, and parent connectedness to the school. The District Leader Academy in Character Education (dLACE) works directly with school district leadership to teach, train, and equip them to lead the implementation of the process. This character development work also aligns with DESE standards. Since inception, dLACE participant districts report:

- Higher APR scores than the state average
- A twofold increase in their understanding of evidence-based character education practices and their ability to facilitate them





"Crosswalk our framework with the 11 Principles and the ABCs of Character Education, evaluate our current practices, and increase intentionality of the framework with a plan for data collection."
