



CharacterPlus® Celebrates Local Schools Receiving 2025 National Schools of Character Distinction

(May 22, 2025) St. Louis, MO... CharacterPlus®, the longest-running character education initiative in the country, is proud to announce Missouri's 13 schools named 2025 National Schools of Character. These schools have demonstrated a focus on character development which has positively impacted academic achievement, student behavior, and school climate. Nationally, 71 schools and 3 districts received the honor this year.

All of the schools selected as National Schools of Character have demonstrated exemplary implementation of Character.org's *11 Principles of Effective Character Education*, a framework for whole-school improvement. This designation lasts for five years.

One of the highlights of our year at CharacterPlus is recognizing the hard work and dedication of these schools. "We are so proud of our partner schools for their intentional and continued commitment to creating a positive, caring culture and climate throughout their school communities," said Debbie Brandt, Missouri Schools of Character Coordinator. "Their dedication to continuous improvement and efforts to ensure a sense of belonging for students, staff, and parents is to be commended and celebrated."

CharacterPlus member schools and districts historically represent more than 20% of the nation's National School of Character designees.

This year, one local school previously recognized as a National School of Character reapplied and received the designation for the fourth time, meaning they have been involved in the Schools of Character process since 2008. That school is:
