

## **Are you collecting my or my child's personal information?**

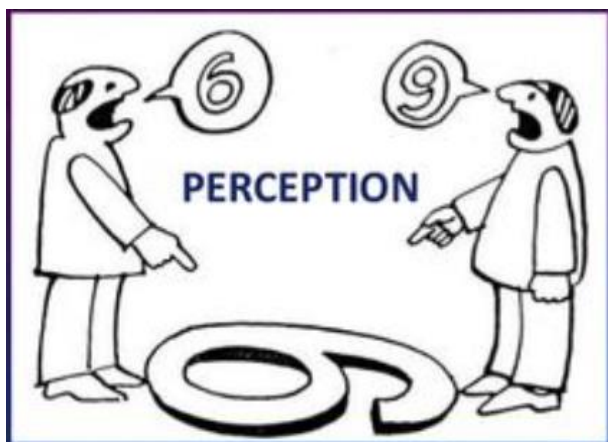
No. The cSurvey is completely anonymous; we do not collect any identifying information on students, teachers, or parents. The results we receive are not associated with your name or email. The report created for the school only identifies whether responses came from parents, staff members, or students, and student responses are disaggregated by grade level, gender, and ethnicity.

## **My third grader doesn't know what autonomy or competence means. How can she answer survey questions about that?**

All of our questions are written in student-friendly language. Students are encouraged to be honest about how they feel about the questions asked.

## **Isn't this just perception data? How can that be considered reliable?**

Perception data, while based on individuals' experiences and feelings, is a crucial component of understanding the overall climate and culture within our schools. This type of data provides insights into how students, parents, and staff perceive their environment, which can highlight areas of strength and opportunities for improvement that might not be evident through other types of data.





### **What if I don't know the answer to a question?**

Your participation in the survey helps us gather a comprehensive view of the school climate and culture. Even if you can't answer every question, the information you do provide is crucial for us to make informed decisions and improvements.

If you genuinely don't know the answer to a question, it's perfectly okay to skip it. Your responses are valuable, and it's better to provide accurate information for the questions you can answer.

If you have a general idea but aren't completely sure, you can provide your best estimate. Your perspective is important, and even an approximate answer can be helpful.

### **Will I see the results of this survey?**

Schools are given a copy of their results a couple of weeks after the survey window is closed. Please contact your building administrator for more information.

### **What are these survey results used for?**

Primarily, these results are used by building administrators and their school's culture and climate or character education team to reflect on their current implementation and set goals for future implementation of their character initiative. Survey results provide valuable insights that inform our decision-making processes. Whether it's developing new programs, adjusting existing policies, or addressing specific concerns, the data helps us make informed choices that reflect the needs and preferences of our school community.

In Missouri, many schools/districts use the responses to some of the questions to do their mandatory [MSIP6 data](#) reporting to the Missouri Department of Education.
